The three major aspects of our mission are: 1) Empowering: to provide transitional jobs, life skills, emotional competencies, and entrepreneurship opportunities for individuals seeks to move beyond poverty; 2) Rebuilding: to serve as an economic catalyst for the severely depressed Highland Park commercial district; and 3) Connecting: to provide an opportunity for all residents of Richmond to connect across divisions that characterize our city.

Policies and Standards of Conduct

Relationships - Romantic and/or overtly affectionate relationships during volunteer hours at Boaz and Ruth time are not permitted. Participation in such actions are strictly prohibited. This is for the safety of all parties involved. Additionally, if you ever feel intimidated or threatened by anyone in our facilities, Boaz & Ruth is committed to intervening on your behalf. Please report your concerns immediately to a the proper staff member on the Connecting team. We are dedicated to have a safe and comfortable volunteer environment.

Money - we discourage the exchange of money and gifts between any volunteers, Boaz & Ruth members, and Highland Park residents with the exception of special celebrations.
